#### **Amy Hudkins Macht**

Amy Macht was born on May 17, 1974 in Salem, OR to Susan M. Hudkins and Charles Hudkins. She passed away on April 15, 2025 after a long battle with Huntington's Disease.

Amy was educated in Salem public schools and graduated from South Salem High School in 1992.

Amy spent many summers as a camper and a counselor at YMCA Camp Silver Creek. (Camp name: Amos) She affected many lives at Camp and retained many camp friendships throughout her life.

Her education continued at the University of Oregon where she graduated from the Honors College in 1996. She then earned her MD degree from OHSU in Portland in 2000 and completed her residency in psychiatry at Tulane University in 2002.



Amy and Marlow Macht were married at Camp Silver Creek on July 30, 2005. They spent three more years at Tulane in New Orleans and five years in Denver, Colorado while Marlow completed his training in emergency medicine and EMS. During those years, Amy and Marlow greeted two sons to their family, Elijah and Aaron.

Amy traveled the world in her youth with a trip to Europe with her parents at age 16 and another trip to Europe with a friend prior to entering college. During college she attended a fellow camp counselor's wedding in Melbourne, Australia and enjoyed a travel abroad semester in Seville, Spain while at the University of Oregon. She capped that trip with a visit to another fellow camp counselor in Israel. Marlow and Amy traveled together to Ecuador in South America and to Cape Town, South Africa before "settling" in Vancouver, Washington.

Amy's medical career was cut short by a relatively early onset of Huntington's Disease, but she will be remembered as a wonderful mother, a coura-

geous fighter, and a loyal friend.

#### Pool replacement update

As we all know, the deferred maintenance at camp has gotten to be quite a long list of projects. The state has a small man power complement and a limited budget so the list just keeps getting longer each year.

To address this problem a new group has been formed called the Camp Silver Creek Reinvestment Working Group. This group consists of very senior Oregon State Parks employees, (OPRD) Park rangers and managers, the YMCA, Opal Creek

ancient forest center, Straub Outdoors, Friends of Silver Falls, SHPO, and the CSCAA.

This group is tasked with finding a way to catch up with, and fund the future of these deferred projects so that we have a safe and vibrant camp well into the future. Meanwhile, the OPRD has indicated in an email that the pool location, while not their first choice may be approved in its current location. SHPO has indicated the same in an email. While email is not a formal approval, it is an indication that the site will be approved.


OPRD has stated that no construction may begin until the CSC Working Group has finished their work. A good guess will be sometime this summer.

Another complication is the proximity of the pool to Northern Spotted OWL nesting habitat. Construction creates a lot of noise and we cannot proceed during nesting season which ends at the end of August. The last week of Camp also occurs around that time.

Here is one possible time line.

- Working group finishes around mid-summer
- Formal written approval from OPRD and SHPO to construct the new pool in the present location
- Formal technical drawings are completed (approximately 30 days). At that point we will know the total cost of the project
- Selective fundraising begins
- Pool reconstruction project goes out to bid to all interested contractors (approximately 30 days)
- Construction contract is awarded
- Construction begins (approximately 4 months to completion)

All this of course assumes that there are no unforeseen problems and or delays. Updates will be provided to the CSACAA as events occur. This is a complicated process and we must proceed one step at a time.
