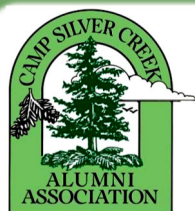

## Mike Smith Award winner

As we neared the end of our 2025 Silver Creek camping season, the inaugural version of a special new award was presented. A small group of CSCAA officers and friends, in consultation with Michael G. Smith's family members, collaborated on the award. Mike was a counselor at 15 and rumor has it he had 2 cabins. (Caveat .. we all know that's not legal now !) Later he went on to be a unit Director, a Camp Director at the Berkeley, California YMCA - then back to Silver Creek as camp director in 1973. Mike was the impetus behind the Golf Tournament and the CSCAA, having also led many camp repair projects by then. Mike was a teacher, with nature and especially Silver Creek, his favored class room.



Kids wouldn't just play in the creek under Mike's watch, they'd turn over rocks, learn what the bugs they found were and about their life cycle too! Walking down a trail would double an exciting botany lesson. His leadership style always drew others in and was a joy to witness. For both kids and fellow staff alike it would become an exciting adventure. In deference to Mike's humility, our consensus in honoring him was that "The Spirit of Leadership Award" main focus is to shine the light on a Silver Creek staff member. They're the ones doing the good work each year, leaving an impact that will last a lifetime.

As intended, the award reads:

## ***Macht memorial***

In honor of Amy Hudkins Macht, who passed away last spring, Chuck Hudkins graciously asked for memorial donations to be directed to the CSCAA.

Over \$2000 has been received in Amy's memory. At the August CSCAA meeting, it was decided to use this money for one or two "larger" projects at camp. A committee was formed and met in September. The take away from that meeting was 1. replace the Huckleberry bush with a plant/plants suited to the environment; 2. assist with putting in a new dock; and 3. help refurbishing the campfire circle.

Jim Trett and Jo Jablo met with Park Ranger Jason in October to discuss these options. He stated they were good projects and also already on the Parks list of projects. Jason asked that we work with Champoege Nursery and the park's horticulturist to select plants, and with the park to do the actual planting.

The park does not allow memorial plaques permanently attached to anything, so we are looking into a plaque/stone that can be moved out in the fall for a "in memory" dedication.

Planting will hopefully take place this fall and other work will be conducted next spring.

## ***Pool replacement update***

On October 15, 2025 Venessa Fiedler, YMCA Senior Director of Youth Programs and Services, Jim Trett, President of the Camp Silver Creek Alumni Association and Guy Greider, Camping Committee Chair met with Guy Rodrigue, OPRD and Ryan Sparks, OPRD. The purpose of the meeting was to ask that the pool replacement project at Silver Creek be separated from the work of the Camp Silver Creek Reinvestment Working Group. That group is tasked with developing a sustainable economic model for the necessary ongoing maintenance at camp.

While we did not get the answer that we wanted, the meeting was a productive discussion and the point was made that the new pool would not cost the state any money which was a concern. Further meetings are scheduled and it is hoped that progress can be made.



## ***Fraggle reflects***

This summer at Silver Creek was a great one! We had 927 unique campers attend CSC, and overall provided \$28k in scholarships. Some summer highlights included an all Y staff event during early June, the great CSCAA work party and annual meeting, the golf tournament, and getting to spend so many amazing days at camp with our incredible campers and staff.

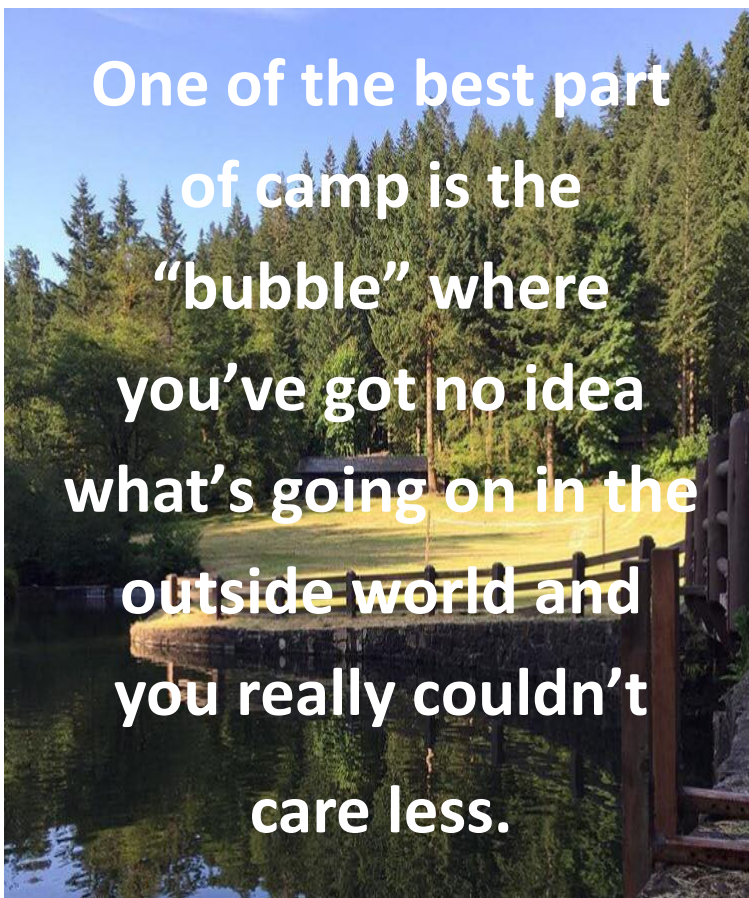
